Content

Which methods do or should researchers working in the field of normative and applied ethics use? These are the central questions of this seminar. One cannot properly address them without talking about the deeper lying question whether we can gain moral knowledge at all. And this directly leads to the metaethical epistemological debate.

So, in course of the seminar, participants will discuss different normative methods against the background of metaethical positions like, e.g., intuitionism, coherentism, and ideal observer theories. More specifically, the participants will think about the role of moral intuitions, the reflective equilibrium, and thought experiments in moral argumentations and justifications. Also, conceptual engineering in ethics will be a topic of the seminar. The seminar closes with focussing on methods of applied ethics as a special branch of normative ethics.

Learning Objectives and Outcomes

- Discussion of different normative methods
- Reflection on how to gain moral knowledge
- Introduction to metaethical epistemology

Target Group

The seminar is aimed at normative philosophers who want to reflect on their methods and at empirical researchers who want to better understand (if and) how moral knowledge can be acquired.
