Prof. Yash Pal Ghai is a scholar specialized in public, constitutional, and human rights law. He was from 1989 until his retirement in 2005 the Sir YK Professor of Public Law at the University of Hong Kong. He also taught and researched at the Yale Law School, Harvard Law School, University of Warwick, Uppsala University in Sweden, Wisconsin Law School, the International Legal Centre in New York, and in Dar-es-Salaam. From 2000 to 2004 he was the Chairman of the Constitution of Kenya Review Commission. As of 2007 he is the head of the Constitution Advisory Support Unit of the United Nations Development Programme in Nepal. Until 2008, he was a Special Representative of the UN Secretary General in Cambodia on human rights. He has been a Fellow of the British Academy since 2005.

Prof. Ben Chigara is a scholar specialized in international, public and human rights law. He currently teaches at the Brunel University of London, where he is the Founding Director of the Centre for International and Public Law. Previously he taught at Warwick University, Leeds University, Oxford Brookes University, Nottingham University, in Denmark and in Zimbabwe. He is consultant to the European Scientific Foundation, European Commission, the International Labour Organization, the Organisation for Security and Cooperation in Europe's, and the Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights.
